# INTRODUCTION

**Today's reality** is a unique concentration in less than three hectares of **world-class museums and cultural institutions**. All styles and architectures are to be admired here: from the Dark Ages to the Renaissance, from the pure 18th century Classicism of Royal Square and Museum Square to the 20th century's beauty of the Centre for Fine Arts by Horta. And for some, the post war architecture of the Royal Library is a gem.

**The historical reality.** Mont des Arts was the seat of government from the early Middle Ages for the Dukes of Brabant. The Dukes of Burgundy provided Mont des Arts with a particular splendour, building here Europe's most prestigious royal palace and hosting the famous Burgundy library, which had no equivalent at the time.

This sumptuous palace was at its zenith under Emperor Charles V, who abdicated there in 1555. It remained the seat of government under the Spanish and Austrian Hapsburgs, and Charles de Lorraine added the stamp of ostentatious grandeur to the power. And it was at Mont des Arts that our first sovereign took his oath on 21 July 1831, 175 years ago.

“The Mont des Arts: a real dream, a dream beyond reality”

The dream is to transform Mont des Arts into a museum quarter, where it will be a **delight to discover art and culture in a relaxing and enchanting environment**. It will be a location where the pedestrian is king, where one can stroll safely from one building to another. This is the real dream of the ten institutions situated in the Mont des Arts quarter: the Royal Museums of Fine Arts of Belgium, the Palais des Congrès, the Royal Library of Belgium, the Musical Instruments Museum, the National Archives of Belgium, the Centre for Fine Arts, the Belgian Royal Film Archive, the ING Cultural Centre, the former Palace of Charles V, and the BELvue.

These ten institutions have taken the initiative to make their dream come true: they have joined in one non-profit making association in order to create a Museum Quarter in Brussels. There is a long road to travel, but, as the Chinese proverb says: “a one thousand-mile journey starts with the first step”.

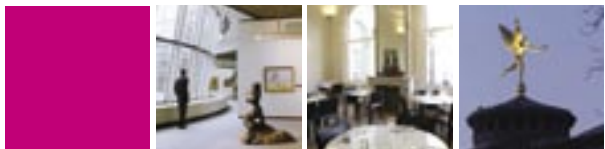
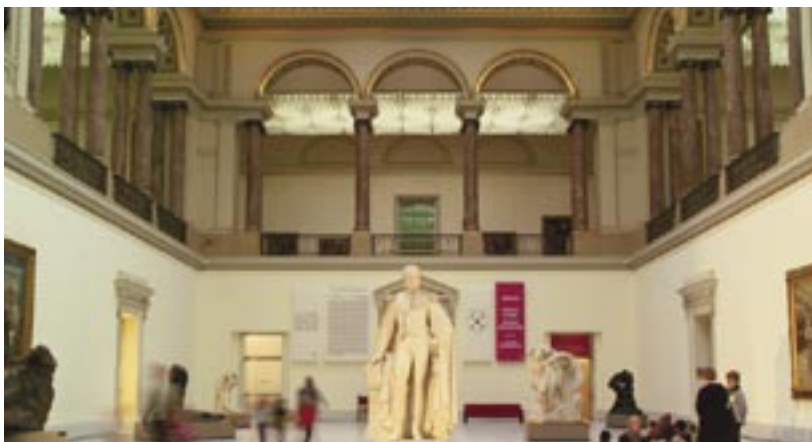

# ROYAL MUSEUMS OF FINE ARTS OF BELGIUM



The Royal Museums of Fine Arts have been the most visited group of museums in Belgium since several decades and they are the most appreciated by foreign visitors. Located in Brussels, they consist of the Ancient Art Museum, the Modern Art Museum, the Wiertz Museum and the Meunier Museum. They hold **some 20,000 paintings, sculptures and drawings.**

In the heart of the Mont des Arts, the **Museum of Ancient Art** houses a vast collection of precious paintings by the Primitive Flemish artists, Bruegel, Rubens, Jordaens and the masters from foreign schools. It offers a vast overview from the 14th till the 18th century.

The neighbouring **Museum of Modern Art** offers a rich panorama of the 19th century (Ensor, Khnopff...) and the 20th century, spread over eight floors, with halls dedicated to Delvaux and Magritte, the largest collection in the world!

On a regular basis, the Royal Museums of Fine Arts organise exhibitions. In 2007, "Hergé and the world of Art" will explore the relationship between the famous draughtsman and the Arts of his time. From September on, Pieter-Paul Rubens, his work and workshop will be the subject of a vast exhibition.

# MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS MUSEUM



At the end of the 19th century, the luxurious shops “Old England” acquired a grand reputation thanks to their very particular building. The entrance is a pearl of Art nouveau. The rest of the buildings is in perfect harmony with the place Royale complex in neo-classical style. You can discover all this in walking distance from the Grand-Place and the Central railway station.

The MIM moved to this architectural jewel on the hill of the Mont des Arts in June 2000.

The museum houses one of the **most renowned collections of the world**. In all, **about 1,500 instruments are exhibited**, from the viola de gambe of the Brussels Court to the Russian theremin of the 20th century, from the African kora to the Irish uilleann pipes. The instruments and their history will bear no more secrets! Don't miss the instruments of Adolphe Sax!

The MIM is, above all, a world of music. With the infrared headphones, each visitor can explore the thematic paths while listening to the beautiful sounds of the instruments.

**Have you ever wondered how much you really know about Belgium and its kings?** Located on the Mont des Arts, next to the Royal Palace and right across from the Royal Park, the BELvue museum is the only museum that reveals the history of Belgium right in front of you.

From the popular uprising in 1830 to the federal State of today: the museum offers the opportunity to examine unique historical documents, remarkable film fragments, striking photos and impressive objects. The reigns of the kings connect the milestones from Belgian history, such as the struggle for universal suffrage, the World Wars and the Royal Question, the Golden Sixties and the recent constitutional reforms. These milestones are presented to you in an exceptional and informative manner. But the very location and history of the building itself are also worth a visit. Before it became a museum, the former 18th century luxury hotel was also a royal residence. You will still find aspects from that era: with the recent renovation, the atmosphere of the old days was restored.

The BELvue museum has a restaurant with a summer café in the royal garden, a modern museum shop, a multipurpose conference room and a hall for educational projects.

# FORMER PALACE OF BRUSSELS ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE OF THE COUDENBERG



The palace of Brussels was first built on Coudenberg hill from the 11th century and was subsequently rebuilt, extended and improved in line with the increased prestige of the Dukes of Brabant, then the Dukes of Burgundy, the Emperor Charles the Fifth and finally the Archdukes Albert and Isabel.

For several centuries, the Palace was the centre of power. Distinguished visitors from all over Europe were attracted by the beauty of the buildings, the gardens and the richness of the Palace's artistic collection. This prestigious monument was unfortunately destroyed by a huge fire in 1731 and disappeared when the district was redeveloped after 1775. Over the last 15 years, excavations of the site have unearthed various archaeological remains of the Palace as well as the surrounding town. The vestiges are accessible to the public. A **subterranean tour** shows the caves of the main building of the medieval castle, halls under the Palace's chapel, the Isabelle Street that ran along the Lalaing House and went from the Coudenberg to the Saint Michael and Gudule collegiate church, and the lower levels of the Aula Magna.

A **fascinating walk beneath the place Royale** gives you the opportunity to discover the vestiges of this illustrious Palace, unjustly forgotten by history.

The Royal Library of Belgium is the **national scientific library of the Belgian Federal State**. It preserves an important cultural heritage.

The general collections hold, amongst others, prints, newspapers and periodicals, official documents and the Legal Depot. Since 1966, the latter preserves each and every work published in Belgium or published abroad but written by a Belgian author.

The Library also houses some special sections: the **Precious Reserve**, which keeps old printings (15th - end 18th century); **Maps and plans**, which offers over 200,000 maps, atlases and globes; a section **Manuscripts**, with some 35,000 manuscripts (i.a. several codices from the Middle Ages); a **Music section**, with numerous scores, works on music and records; and a **Medal section**, that preserves and studies a very vast and rich collection of numismatic pieces, coins and tokens as for instance the *tetra-drachme of Aetna* from the 5th century B.C., unique in the world! The ancient residence of Charles of Lorraine houses the **Museum of the 18th century**, the **Chalcography** and the **Engravings** collection of the Royal Library.

The Royal Library organises also temporary exhibitions and guided tours 'behind the scene'.

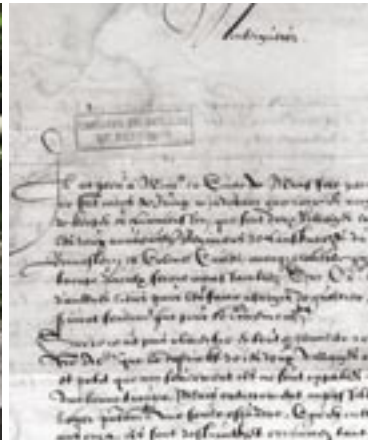

# NATIONAL ARCHIVES OF BELGIUM



The National Archives have proven their role as guardians of the memory of the Nation, the country and its citizens. The institute appeared as from 1789 as a necessary attribute to each democratic government.

The network of the State Archives was structured in 1796. The seat in Brussels became national in 1830: the National Archives of Belgium were located at the bottom of the Mont des Arts. The concerted action of Charles Rogier and the general archivist Gachard reinforced the institution as a true auxiliary to the authorities, whose authentic documents it preserves.

The State Archives count **20 divisions throughout the country** and preserve mostly **unique pieces**. The documents from administrative and judiciary bodies are gathered there after 100 years, as well as archives from private persons. Today, the depot of the State preserves 200 kilometres of documents, some of which are magnificently illustrated manuscripts, or date back a thousand years. The institute's mission is not only to **open its doors to the authorities, but also to the public: the citizen, the researcher**.

New challenges lay ahead. Far from limiting themselves to the analysis of ancient documents, archivists discover and learn new working methods to handle archives created by new technologies.

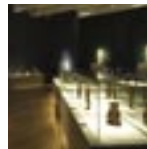
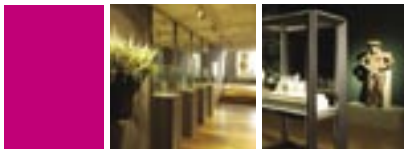


# ING CULTURAL CENTRE



The ING Cultural Centre is located within a cluster of buildings on Brussels' place Royale. Designed by Barnabé Guimard and built between 1776 and 1782, the complex is regarded as one of the finest examples of neo-classical architecture. The Cultural Centre currently occupies two period townhouses that are situated between the Church of St. Jacques sur Coudenberg and the portico on rue de Namur, and which, in the late 18th century and early 19th century, were home to Ferdinand-Pierre Rapedius de Berg and Count Charles d'Allegambe.

Since 1986, ING has hosted and organised many **prestigious exhibitions** as part of its programme to **promote Belgian and international art**. The building underwent a complete renovation to ensure that it satisfied all of the security requirements of a modern exhibition space. This work was duly recognised in 2000 with the awarding of the prestigious Caius Prize from the Promethea Foundation. It has also enabled the bank to exhibit masterpieces from the world's most important collections, notably the Metropolitan Museum and Brooklyn Museum in New York, the Hermitage and Kremlin Museum in Russia, the Louvre, and the Royal Collections in England... Having assumed an active role at the heart of the vibrant artistic centre that is Mont des Arts, ING has become one of the major players in Belgian cultural life.

# BELGIAN ROYAL FILM ARCHIVE



The **Royal Film Archive** is **one of the oldest and richest film archives in the world**. Since 1938 it has been preserving a collection of films with a permanent esthetical, technical and historical value: short films, full-length fiction films and documentaries from all over the world. The archive is situated in an **old city mansion** dating from the 15th century and built by the family **de Clèves-Ravenstein** in the proximity of the Palace of Emperor Charles the Fifth. The building in Brabant gothic style has survived the radical changes that took place in the quarter of the Mont des Arts during subsequent eras. This building is not open to the public, but the facades and the inner courtyard can still be admired.

The **Film Museum** was created in 1962 with the purpose to enhance the diffusion of the vast collection, through the regular projection of sound film and silent films. The latter are accompanied by live piano music. The museum also presents a permanent exposition on the film history. Due to renovation works the museum will close temporarily. During that time the Film Archive will continue with its varied array of public activities on alternative locations and its collaboration with scientific, educational and cultural institutions of the Mont des Arts.

The **Documentation Centre** disposes of a specialised photo-library and a library with a public reading room.

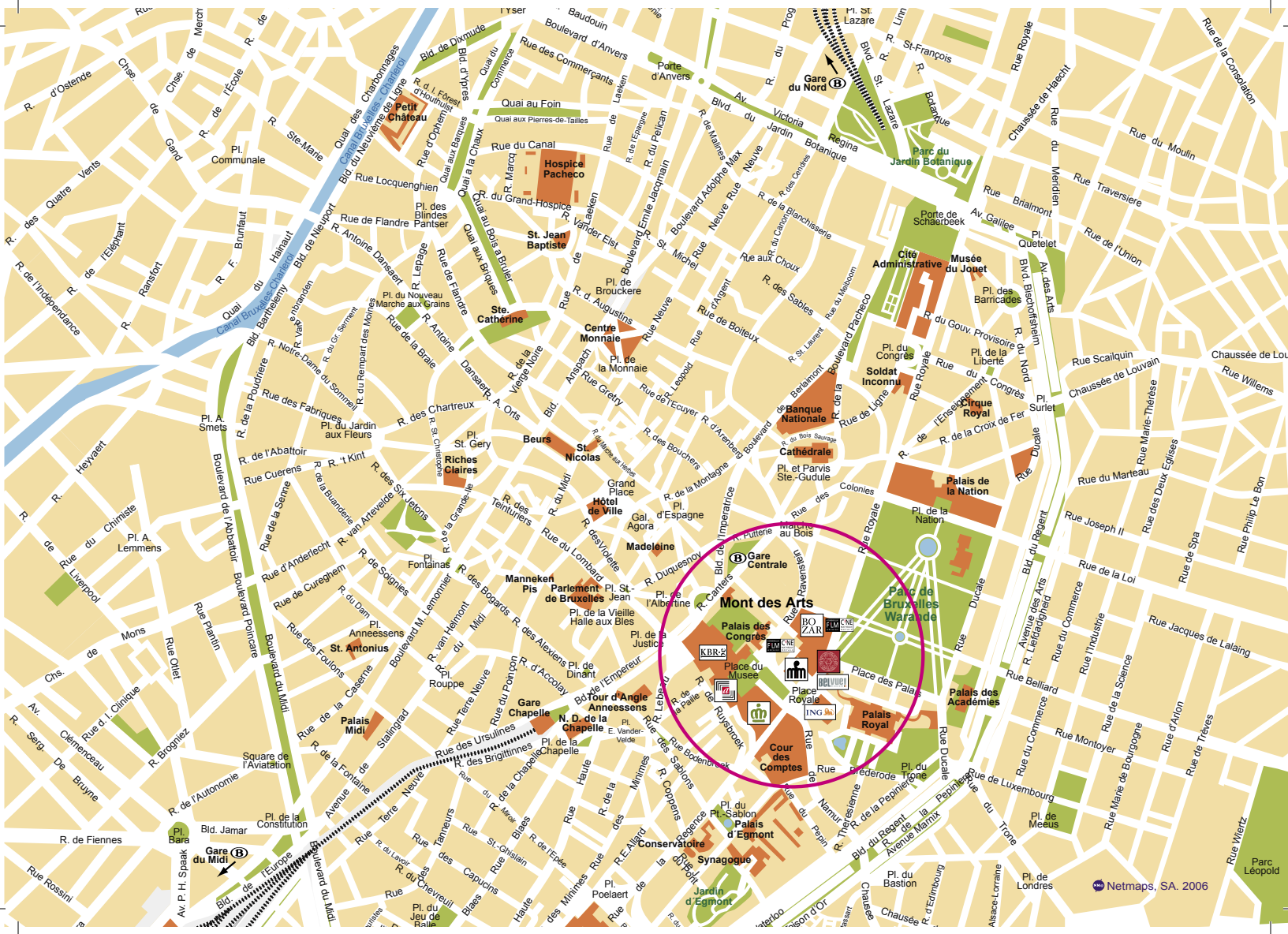
